

The ON-OFF Project

ON-OFF aims to develop a model containing intervention strategies that will contribute to prevent and respond to cyber sexual and genderbased violence, such as online harassment/bullying. It focuses on: capacity-building of teachers/ educators, awareness-raising of young and adult participants and the general public, education and empowerment of girls and boys. The goal is to combat the belittlement of these kind of abuse: indeed, "ON-OFF" acronym wants to highlight offline, concrete, negative implications of online violence.

ON-OFF aims to fight against gender stereotypes, supporting participants to become more aware and conscious of prejudices and their effects, promoting lower tolerance towards GBV and highlighting their interconnection.

The project will focus on cyber GBV, as it is a new phenomenon, particularly spread among young people, it is still underestimated and undercondemned, also by adults. For this reason, the project involves both youngsters and teachers/ educators, as professionals responsible for their education. Also, the project will develop an online platform, with workshop traces and material, open and free to everyone interested.










Information about the ON-OFF project

Objectives

- to prevent cyber GBV violence among young people
- to highlight its offline concrete consequences and end tolerance
- to tackle gender stereotypes, promoting behavioural changes
- to raise awareness and empower young people and adults responsible for their education
- to increase the capacity of teachers/educators
- to prevent online GBV, reducing the n. of victims
- to spread the rights of girls and women, combat victimblaming and educate to empathy and respect

INTERVENTION MODEL DESIGN

The objective of ON-OFF Intervention model is to design an edicuational and awareness model to prevent online GBV

INTERVENTION MODEL IMPLEMENTATION


ANALYSIS OF THE BEHAVIORAL CHANGE

The analysis of the effectiveness and the impact of the ON-OFF model, especially in terms o change of social attitudes of participants, behavior and relationships.

Target Group

The 1st target group is the teachers/ educators, as professionals involved in educating children to respect everyone, overcome stereotypes, and possibly support in case of (cyber) GBV.

The 2nd target group is young people aged 12-17: they are mature enough to deal with project topics and are particularly affected by the problem.



The Problem

Gender-based violence (GBV), one of the oldest crime of human history, is based on gender stereotypes and inequalities. Now it is exacerbated by new technologies, which strengthen over-generalisations, offer anonymity to perpetrators and make abuse proliferate very fast. Young people are frequent users of internet, but are often unable to have responsible/respective relations.

Expected Results

- empowered partcipants to actively prevent and fight against GBV
- increased capacity of critical understanding of gender stereotypes
- lowered tolerance towards any form of GBV and victim-blamings
- $\mbox{-}\mbox{ timulated}$ respectful and responsible relations among teenagers
- decreased the n. of harmful episodes
- promoted active engagement and stimulted responsiveness of entities/territories
